Letter from the Chair

Dear Colleagues and Friends of the Department,




Jonathan Weitz Receives Mentored Research Scientist Development Award

Jay Doucet Departs from UC San Diego Department of Surgery


Jay Doucet, M.D., served as the chief of the Division of Trauma, Surgical Critical Care, Burns and Acute Care


