Letter from the Chair

Dear Colleagues and Friends of the Department,

Spring is in the air, and it is one of the most exciting days of the year as the results of the "Match" have been made known. The "Match" is a coordinated process that pairs senior medical students with their future residency training programs. It marks the end of a long season of applications, interviews and difficult ranking decisions for both residency programs and students. To give some perspective, our general surgery residency program had more than 1,500 applicants and interviewed 87 candidates to fill seven slots.

The "Match" is a highlight of the year for the department as we meet the new faces who will bring energy, new ideas and fresh experiences to our patients and our program. In this month's newsletter, we are excited to announce the results of our four primary residency programs — cardiothoracic surgery, general surgery, plastic surgery and vascular surgery. A theme of renewal and rejuvenation runs through the rest of this month's newsletter. 
These included the Western Trauma Association Meeting, held in Whistler, British Colombia, and the American College of Surgeons Cancer Conference, held in Phoenix, AZ.


Tatiana Hurtado de Mendoza Receives Curebound Grant for Breast Cancer Research






Humans of Surgery
