

## Letter from the Chair

Dear Colleagues and Friends of the Department,

With June just two days away, it's hard to believe that the school year is coming to an end. Next week, we will celebrate the graduation of our senior medical students who are about to begin residency training all across the United States. It feels like just yesterday that they were bright-eyed first-year medical students, anxious about the rigorous coursework, how they would interact with patients and their uncertain futures. They leave us still having much to learn, but with the confidence that they will make a significant impact in the lives of many. We are incredibly proud of each one of them.

It has been a busy month in the Department of Surgery. Earlier this week, we hosted one of my favorite events of the year: our Annual Department of Surgery Research Symposium at the Ida and Cecil Green Faculty Club. The event featured 60 research poster presentations and 18 oral abstract presentations delivered by surgeonscientists, non-clinician PhD scientists, students, and residents. It showcased an incredible array of innovations, all aimed at improving the future for patients with surgical diseases and conditions.

This year's symposium keynote speaker was Martha Zeiger, M.D., an internationally recognized endocrine surgeon-scientist who serves as the Director of the Center for Surgeon-Scientist Development at the National Cancer Institute in the National Institutes of Health. She discussed the success of surgical science, particularly highlighting the achievements of surgeon-scientists who develop research programs and secure funding at rates comparable to physicians from internal medicine and other disciplines. She emphasized the importance of leadership in surgical research and offered tips on how to thrive in an ever-changing landscape.

For this month's Q&A, we sat down with Anne Wallace, M.D., chief of the Division of Breast Surgery and director of the UC San Diego Comprehensive Breast Health Center. She has been a fixture at UC San Diego for decades, starting from her residency, and is a leader in the field of breast oncology. She is unique in having trained in both breast surgical oncology and plastic surgery, which provides an important perspective on the challenges that patients with breast cancer face. The breast health programs at UC San Diego, housed in the Moores Cancer Center, are a critical resource for patients throughout San Diego and Southern California.

In this month's newsletter, we are also happy to highlight the recent presidential address that Sonia Ramamoorthy, M.D., chief of the Division of Colon and Rectal Surgery, delivered to the American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons (ASCRS). ASCRS is the largest society of colon and rectal surgeons with more than 4,000 members. It is an extraordinary honor and responsibility to serve as president of ASCRS, an organization with many programs and initiatives that aim to improve patient care through education, professional development, and innovation. Congratulations, Dr. Ramamoorthy!


## Feature Article: 13th Annual Department of Surgery Research Symposium

## **Division of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery Milestone**

A project led by Sean Perez, M.D., and Elsie Ross, M.D., in the Division of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery, reached a major milestone. Collaborating with the Department of Nanoengineering, they achieved the first

ever remote, ultrasound-based continuous monitoring of arterial vasculature after major vascular surgery. This represents a major step forward in vascular surgery — opening the door to real-time monitoring during inpatient recovery and, potentially, during care after discharge.

UC San Diego researchers to presented their work in plastic surgery and was held in conjunction with the 2nd annual Dr. Ralph E. Holmes Lectureship. ## Sonia Ramamoorthy Speaks at American Society of Colon and Rectal Surgeons Meeting



### World IBD Day


